

The Many Uses of Cannabis / Hemp

For thousands of years the hemp or cannabis plant was the largest agricultural crop in the world, providing us with many of our needs. Cannabis was used to produce paper, Bibles, maps and charts, ropes and sails, clothes, footwear, fuel and many other commodities. It was used commonly as a treatment to many ailments as well as a relaxant. Contrary to popular opinion that cannabis was mainly used in the East, it was so well known under the name of hemp or 'hempe' throughout England in the seventeenth century that Culpeper wrote in his herbal that there was no need to describe it as every good housewife knew the plant so well.

The **RELAXANT**_properties of cannabis reside mainly in the sticky resinous product found most abundantly in the flowering tops of the female plant. The main psychoactive compound is Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC)

The **SEED** of the hemp plant is an excellent food and source of oil. Hemp seeds produce oil for cooking or for lubrication. The seed when eaten is cholesterollowering and full of protein.

The **FIBRE STRANDS** can be spun into thread and used to make rope or woven into durable, high quality textiles. These in turn are used to make clothes, sails, linens and fabrics of all types.

The **HURDS** or pieces of the stalk left after the fibre is removed, is 77% cellulose. This can be used to make dioxin-free paper, packing materials, non-toxic paints and lacquers, industrial fabrication materials such as plastics and chipboard and even bricks.

The **LEAVES**_have use as a recreational and medicinal ameliorant. They can also be eaten as a salad vegetable.

The **ROOTS** play an important part in soil conservation and reclamation, preventing erosion and mudslides. Boiled and made into a poultice, cannabis roots can ease the pain of arthritis and sprains.

As a THERAPEUTIC MEDICINE, both as a preventative measure and cure, cannabis was used for many thousands of years at least since the time of the Ancient Chinese and Ancient Egyptians. Although these medicinal properties have been denied by international treaty, cannabis is still used by many millions of people to relieve their suffering. The range of ailments often eased by smoking cannabis includes Multiple Sclerosis and spasms associated with spasticity, glaucoma, appetite stimulation in AIDS patients, epilepsy, nausea associated particularly with cancer patients undergoing chemotherapy, spinal injury, menstrual pains and childbirth, asthma, depression, migraine, drug addiction and alcoholism, stress, insomnia and even herpes.

The WHOLE PLANT is an extremely valuable source of BIOMASS for the production (through a process of controlled decomposition) of pollution-free fuels. These fuels can be used to power everything from generators and domestic heating to motor cars and jet planes. It could be grown locally and easily, almost anywhere in the world, this creating jobs and giving many people independence from the massive petroleum and nuclear industries. It has been said that the present day profiteering by these companies creates the single-most barrier to legalisation and liberation of the cannabis hemp plant.

Although the Legalise Cannabis Alliance is seen as a single-issue party, my interest in representing you goes much further than cannabis.

This is a chance to make real changes in local Government.

PROPOSALS FOR CANNABIS

That cannabis and cannabis products should be removed from the UK Misuse of Drugs Act, thereby being legalised.

That the possession, cultivation and use of pure cannabis and cannabis products be free from prosecution.

That cannabis be re-introduced into our society.

That high priority be given to the cultivation of cannabis for the express purpose of the localised production of virtually cost-free fuels through the process of pyrolysis on cannabis biomass, and as a source of fibre and hurd.

That provision be made to enable the setting up of public establishments where the use of cannabis is permitted.

That provision be made to enable the setting up of outlets for the legal supply of cannabis.

That the same level of protection be given to the cannabis consumer as is to those who consume other commodities—quality, weights and measures etc.

That all prisoners presently held only on cannabis convictions or charges be released from custody without delay and that all criminal records for cannabis offences be expunged
