Also called hemp, it has many uses, from the production of valuable medicines to pollution-free fuels. It's local cultivation and use for paper, plastic and building materials would boost employment and the local economy.

Legalisation and utilisation of cannabis is about more than just a toke.

#### Different parts of the cannabis plant are useful in different ways.

The **RELAXANT** properties of cannabis reside mainly in the sticky resinous product found most abundantly in the flowering tops of the female plant. The main psychoactive compound is Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC)

The **SEED** of the hemp plant is an excellent food and source of oil. Hemp seeds produce oil for cooking or for lubrication. The seed when eaten is cholesterollowering and full of protein. The leaves and flowers are also edible. The oil from the seeds can also be used to make a range of soaps and cosmetics and shampoos.

The **FIBRE STRANDS** can be spun into thread and used to make rope or woven into durable, high quality textiles. These in turn are used to make clothes, sails, linens and fabrics of all types. The cannabis hemp fibre produces the strongest, long lasting natural fibres in the plant kingdom.

The **HURDS** or pieces of the stalk left after the fibre is removed, is 77% cellulose. This can be used to make dioxin-free paper, packing materials, non-toxic paints and lacquers, industrial fabrication materials such as plastics and chipboard and even bricks. Waste materials are completely biodegradable and no harmful chemicals are needed in the production of these powerful materials.

The **LEAVES** have use as a recreational and medicinal ameliorant. They can also be eaten as a salad vegetable.

The **ROOTS** play an important part in soil conservation and reclamation, preventing erosion and mudslides. Boiled and made into a poultice, cannabis roots can ease the pain of arthritis and sprains.

As a **THERAPEUTIC MEDICINE**, both as a preventative measure and cure, cannabis was used for many thousands of years at least since the time of the Ancient Chinese and Ancient Egyptians. The range of ailments often eased by smoking cannabis includes Multiple Sclerosis and spasms associated with spasticity, glaucoma, appetite stimulation in AIDS patients, epilepsy, nausea associated particularly with cancer patients undergoing chemotherapy, spinal injury, menstrual pains and childbirth, asthma, depression, migraine, drug addiction and alcoholism, stress, insomnia and even herpes.

The WHOLE PLANT is an extremely valuable source of BIOMASS for the production (through a process of controlled decomposition) of pollution-free fuels.
